
The Slip Stitch Cowl Designed by Kris Bart

Kris has been part of the LYS team since we opened in 2012. She's a beloved teacher of new knitters and an expert on the benefits of Malabrigo yarns and designs. She designed this cowl in 2015 to showcase our new Noro Silk Garden, and we love it! We hope you enjoy this design as much as we do!

Abbreviations

K	Knit
P	Purl
SL2	Slip two stitches purl wise
BO	Bind off
M1	From the front, lift the bar between stitches with left needle, knit into back of loop

Gauge: 15 stitches= 4 inches in pattern

Yarn: One skein solid worsted weight yarn and two skeins of any long color changing worsted weight yarn.
197 yards of a solid worsted weight yarn such as Juniper Moon Moonshine and 220 yards of a long color changing worsted weight yarn, such as Noro Silkgarden.

Needles: Size 8, 24-inch circular needle or size needed to get gauge

Other Supplies: stitch marker and tapestry needle

Directions:

Cast on 121 stitches with long tail cast-on using the solid yarn. Join to knit in the round by slipping the first stitch from the right needle to the left, place a marker for beginning of round and knit the first two stitches on the left needle together.

You will have 120 sts.

Rounds 1-5:(K1, P1) repeat around

Round 6: K every stitch with solid color and at the same time increase evenly to 132 stitches as follows:

K5, (M1, knit 10) 11 times, M1, K5.

Round 7: P around with solid color

Round 8-14: Change to colored yarn. (K4, SL2) repeat around

Round 15: K with solid yarn

Round 16: P with solid yarn

Round 17-23: Change to colored yarn. K1, *(SL2, K4) repeat from * around to last 5 stitches. End SL2, K3
Repeat Rounds 6-23 **without the increases** 6 more times or to desired length. End after round 14 or 23.

Next Round: K with solid color

Next Round: P around, at the same time decrease to 120 stitches as follows: P5, (P2 tog, P9) 11 times, P2 tog, P4.

Last 5 rounds: (K1, P1) repeat around. BO in pattern very loosely

Finished Measurements:

27-inch circumference, 13-inch length



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
