



## MOSAIC “CABLE” SCARF

**Level:** Advanced Beginner

**Finished measurement:** Length 56” (or desired length); Width 6” (or desired width)

**Materials:** Yarn: *Lambspun* hand-dyed 100% Prism (50% Merino wool, 50% silk) - 1 skein each of two colors (pattern works best with high-contrast solid colors)

*Note: additional yarn has been included for a longer scarf, if desired.*

**Not included** (but available from Lambspun):

US size 5 needles, stitch markers, tapestry needle

**Gauge:** Not critical for this project.

**Abbreviations:**

Sl st wyib — slip stitch with yarn in back

Sl st wyif — slip stitch with yarn in front



### Instructions:

Using darker color, cast on 39 stitches with a long-chain cast-on method. Continue to work in darker color only for the first six rows.

Row 1: Knit across all stitches.

Rows 2: Purl across all stitches.

Rows 3-6: Repeat Rows 1 & 2 two times.

Row 7: Change to lighter color. (*Do not break darker color; carry “non-working” yarns up the right side, twisting yarns at color change rows.*) Knit across all stitches.

Row 8: Purl across all stitches.

Work chart pattern – knitting right-side rows and purling wrong-side rows, and changing yarn colors, as indicated by the chart— until scarf reaches approximately 56” or desired length, ending on a right side row, with a complete pattern round (i.e., 24 rows/pattern round).

After completing the last pattern round, work Rows 1-6, using dark color only. After completing Row 6, bind off loosely and weave in ends.

*Rules for knitting from a Mosaic pattern chart:*

Dark and white squares represent darker and lighter yarns, respectively.

Each horizontal row of the chart represents **two** rows of knitting – a right-side row and the following wrong side row. This pair of rows is knit using the **same color** of yarn. The right-side row, beginning with an odd number at the right side of the chart is read from right to left. The wrong-side row, designated by an even number on the chart, is worked from left-to-right.


The color of the “working yarn” is indicated by the first square of a row on the right side of the chart. (The same color will be used to work the corresponding wrong-side row.) For example, on every right-side row beginning with a dark square, you will knit all of the dark square stitches and slip (sl st wyib) all of the white square stitches. On the corresponding wrong-side row, you will purl all of the dark square stitches and slip (sl st wyif) all of the white square stitches.

The two vertical lines in the chart are “repeat” lines. The squares outside of the two vertical lines are “edge” stitches. Repeat the pattern between the two lines as many times as required, before knitting the remaining stitches on the outside of the left vertical line.

On every wrong-side row of a mosaic pattern, you can ignore the chart. Simply work the stitches on the needle, purling (for a stockinette pattern, or knitting for a garter stitch pattern) the stitches that correspond to the working yarn color, and slipping (wyif) the stitches of the other color.

## Mosaic "Cable" Pattern

Work pattern repeat **three times** (for a total of 39 stitches, including edge stitches).



*Hint: Use stitch markers to separate horizontal pattern repeats. This will make it easier to "read" the pattern on your needles.*

Work all 24 rows in pattern round for as many times as required to achieve the desired length.

For a wider scarf, cast on additional stitches in multiples of twelve to work additional horizontal repeats.
